**Webinar: Development of NAMAs in the Waste Sector

Agenda**

Around 11.2 billion metric tonnes of solid waste are collected around the world every year, and the decay of its organic portion contributes around 3-5% of global GHG emissions. The fast growing waste stream is increasingly complex to process, while global solid waste generation is on pace to increase 70% by 2025, with costs to deal with waste also rising considerably.

The 60-minute webinar will cover several key elements of NAMA development specific to the waste sector, including MRV, sustainable development co-benefits, and regulatory and institutional considerations. The emphasis will be on real-world applications and an illustrative case study will be presented with sample data to demonstrate the concepts.

The webinar will build on discussions during the March 25<sup>th</sup> entitled **A Conceptual Approach to Mitigation in the Waste Sector** that was also an output of the UNDP LECB Programme's Waste Management Working Group.
